Central Baptist Theological Seminary's mission is:


Central prepares women and men for seeking God, shaping church and serving humanity and all creation.




Student Enrollment Data









Student Demographics




(all programs)







Student Success Rates

Program Learning Outcomes

Doctor of Ministry (English) Outcomes

- 1. The learner will develop a theological construct from which a vision for personal and organizational spirituality and ministry might be developed.
- 2. The learner will gain and improve the necessary skills for successfully guiding ministry innovation and entrepreneurship and for developing vision for effective and sustainable change.
- 3. Through personal assessment and designed learning engagement with others, the learner will enhance his/her abilities to empathize.
- 4. The learner will gain and develop skills for building teams and assessing organizational systems.
- 5. The learner will acquire design thinking skills and utilize them to innovate in an organizational setting.
- 6. The learner will enhance skills for creating and managing budgets, raising funds, and developing ministry resources.

Doctor of Ministry (Korean/Myanmar) Outcomes

- 4. To utilize component competencies gained through the Interpretive, Contextualizing, and Formative pillars to perform skills, techniques, and arts to perfect public practices of ministry and leadership through practical experiences. (Performance)

Master of Arts (Theological Studies) (English/Korean) Outcomes

Master of Arts in Missional Church Studies (Korean) Outcomes

- 1. The student will be able to articulate appropriate theological, contextual, and practical understandings of Christian ministries.
- 2. The student will be able to analyze ministry contexts utilizing methodologies in various disciplines.
- 3. The student will acquire the skills needed to develop ministries that are sensitive to the views and needs of diverse groups in urban/immigrant contexts.
- 4. The student will be able to demonstrate commitment to continuing growth in personal and spiritual maturity.
- 5. The student will gain practical ministry experience through placement in local churches and/or ministry-related organizations.

Master of Christian Care and Counseling

- 1. Articulate appropriate theological, contextual, and practical understandings of Christian ministries.
- 2. Demonstrate knowledge of helping theories and skills fundamental for a variety of ministry settings.
- 3. Demonstrate the ability to integrate theological tenets with helping ministry skills in giving care and counseling.
- 4. Demonstrate the ability to engage in competent care for those seeking guidance and healing.
- 5. Demonstrate commitment to continuing growth in personal and spiritual maturity.

Master of Arts in Counseling

- 1. Demonstrate the ability to provide mental health services to individuals in a diverse multicultural society and in varied clinical settings.
- 2. Demonstrate professional counselor identity in conjunction with appropriate application of counseling theories and engagement in research and professional skills enhancement.

- 3. Demonstrate professional counseling practice by selecting appropriate evidence-based treatments informed by diagnoses.
- 4. Demonstrate the counselor skills and sensibilities for human spirituality needed to establish and maintain rapport and facilitate the treatment process.

Diploma in Theological Studies (English) Outcomes

- 1. Demonstrate consciousness of the particularities that shape faith and practice in a given contextual setting.
- 2. Demonstrate spiritual growth and self-awareness through the application of ministry knowledge and skills, religious commitment, and professional integrity.
- 3. Demonstrate basic skills for discovering understanding and meaning from within the ambiguity and complexity of human experience and knowledge.
- 4. Harmonize interpretation, contextualization, and formation pillar competencies with performance skills, techniques, and arts to improve ministry and leadership practices.
