36 credit hours.

The Master of Arts in Ministry is a professional degree program that equips students for ministry both inside and outside of congregational settings. Tailored for your vocational goals, the MA in Ministry offers a focused route to theological education.

Central's goal is to "educate and form creative leaders to minister to and serve humanity in a rapidly changing global environment." If this describes you, we urge you to consider the MA in Ministry.

Students complete a core curriculum of 24 credit hours and select a concentration. Choose from a pre-determined concentration or design a portion of the program specific to your vocational goals. Students choose 12 hours in the following tracks.

Admissions

Start your application anytime. Classes start in August, January, and May. Official transcripts, character references and an autobiographical statement will be required for admission. Applicants should have a bachelor's degree from an accredited educational institution. A limited number of students without an earned baccalaureate degree or its equivalent may be admitted to the MA program through alternative credentialing. Students participating in the English program for whom English is not their first language will be required to demonstrate their English proficiency.

Tuition & Fees

Central works hard to keep your education as affordable and attainable as possible. In addition to low tuition rates, many programs are eligible for generous scholarships and payment plans.
